Duo-Pianists Are Guest Artists

Edgewood Park School Hears New Artists

A two-piano team which will make its Town Hall debut next week presented its first concert in public last night at Edgewood Park School.

Members of the team, who have studied at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N. Y., are pupils in composition and conducting of Georges Enesco, and in piano of Abby Whiteside, New York City. They are Arthur Whittemore and Jack Lowe.

The couple, heralded by advance reports as one of the outstanding teams today, has been working together for the past couple of years, but has never before appeared in public.

Another distinguishing factor of the performance was that every selection played on the program was an arrangement by the partners.

After opening the program with classical Bach and Handel selections, the pianists threw in a bit of jazz before ending with their own arrangement of Georges Enesco's Rumanian Rhapsody, No. 1.

The program was in four groups, opening with the Overture to "Alexander's Feast," Handel; Allegretto, Handel; "Arrival of the Queen of Sheba" from "Solomon" Handel. A group of three Bach selections, "Wir glauben all an Gott," "Er ist das Heil uns kommenher," and the E. Flat Major Sonata followed. The Sonata is in three movements, allegro moderato, siciliano and allegro. Next they played the Coronation Scene from "Boris Godounov," by Moussorgsky.

The third group included "Beguine the Beguine," Porter; "Temptation," Brown; "Waltz Fantasy," J. Strauss; and "Bolero," Ravel. To end the program they played "Passacaglia," Copeland; "Gymnopédie," Satie; "Marche," Prokofiev; and the Enesco Rumanian Rhapsody No. 1.
